

Palmerston North Medical Research Foundation President's Report

for the year ended 31 March 2016

The Foundation has had a good year. It is pleasing to note the inaugural award of the Duncan Fellowship in Neuromuscular Research, a joint initiative between the Foundation and the Duncan Family Trust.

An excellent **Colloquium** was held at Massey University on Tuesday, 16 August 2016. 59 people attended. Presentations were made by six PNMRF grant recipients. The Foundation is grateful to Dr Nicole Roy for her organisation of this most successful event and to the six grant recipients who presented talks on their work.

This year, applications for grants were of a high standard and it was pleasing to note the large number of applications. The Foundation thanks its Technical Committee for their detailed evaluation of the applications. This year, disbursements by way of grants totalled just under \$94,000. Grants made were as follows:
